# WORLD HISTORY

FROM THE FARTHEST PAST

Simple pyramids at Tenochtitlan, they accompanied its dedication with a perfect orgy of human sacrifice. Like the Mayas, the Aztecs had a system of writing, and they regarded it as a kind of magic. They read the signs of the future in the flight of birds, and they attained to a true literary tone, especially in their songs. One of the most important of these was the "Song of the Death of the Aztecs," which was sung as the Aztecs offered up their victims.

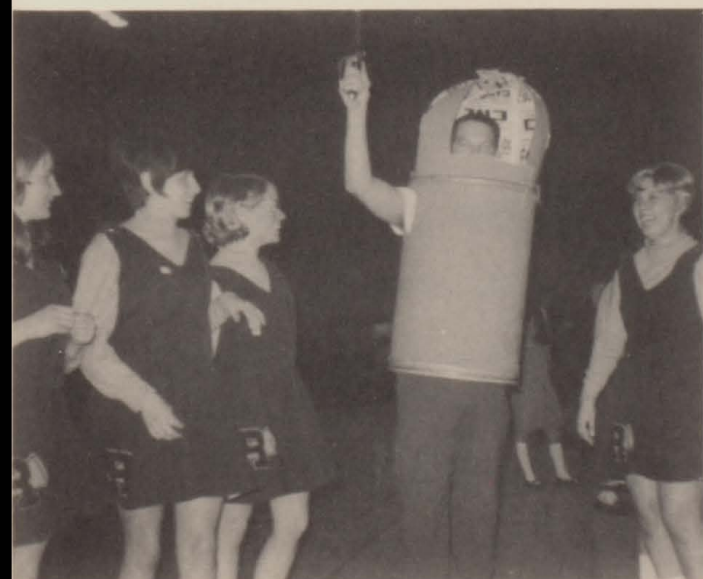
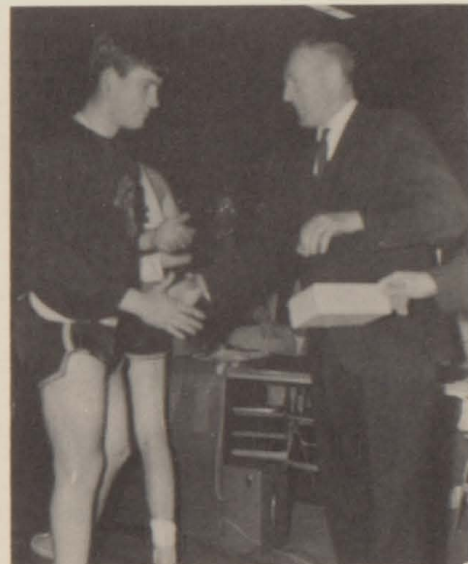
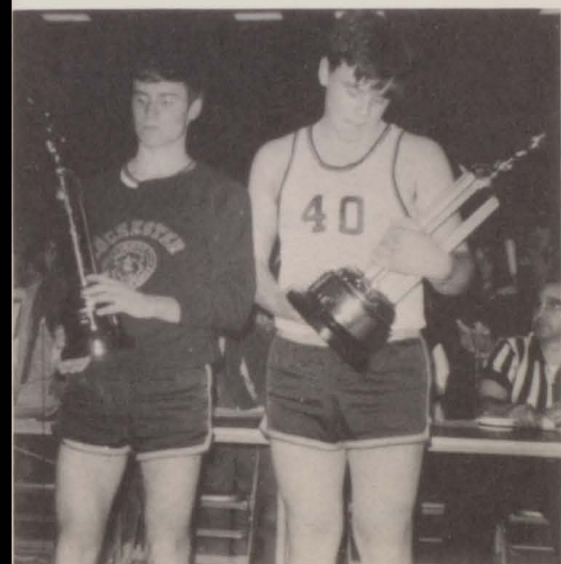
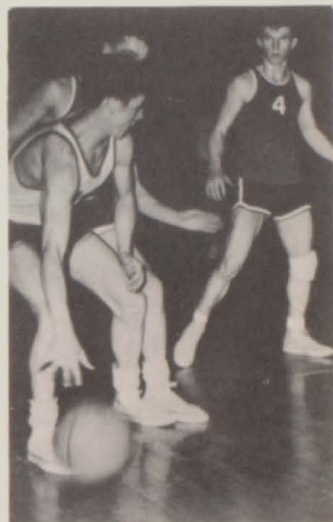


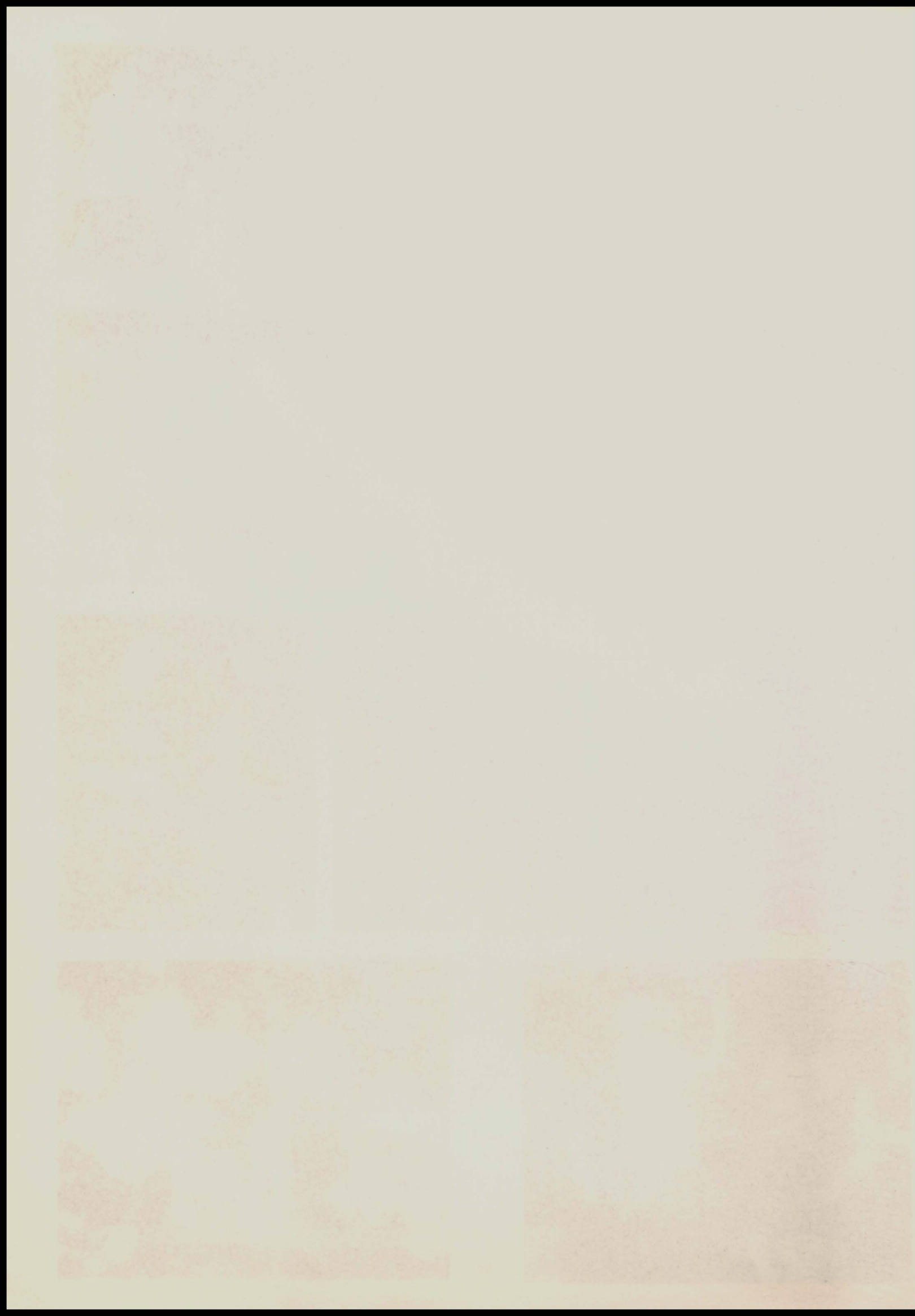




# Champions
