Rochester's Cross Country team was highly successful again this year.

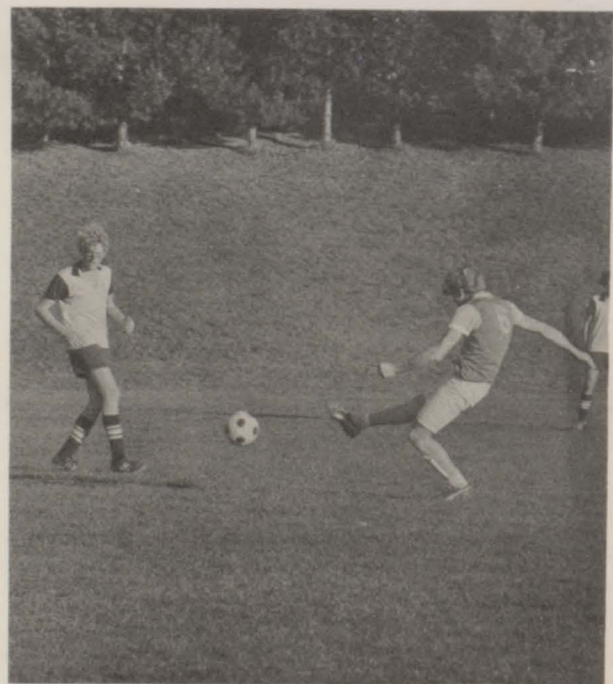
