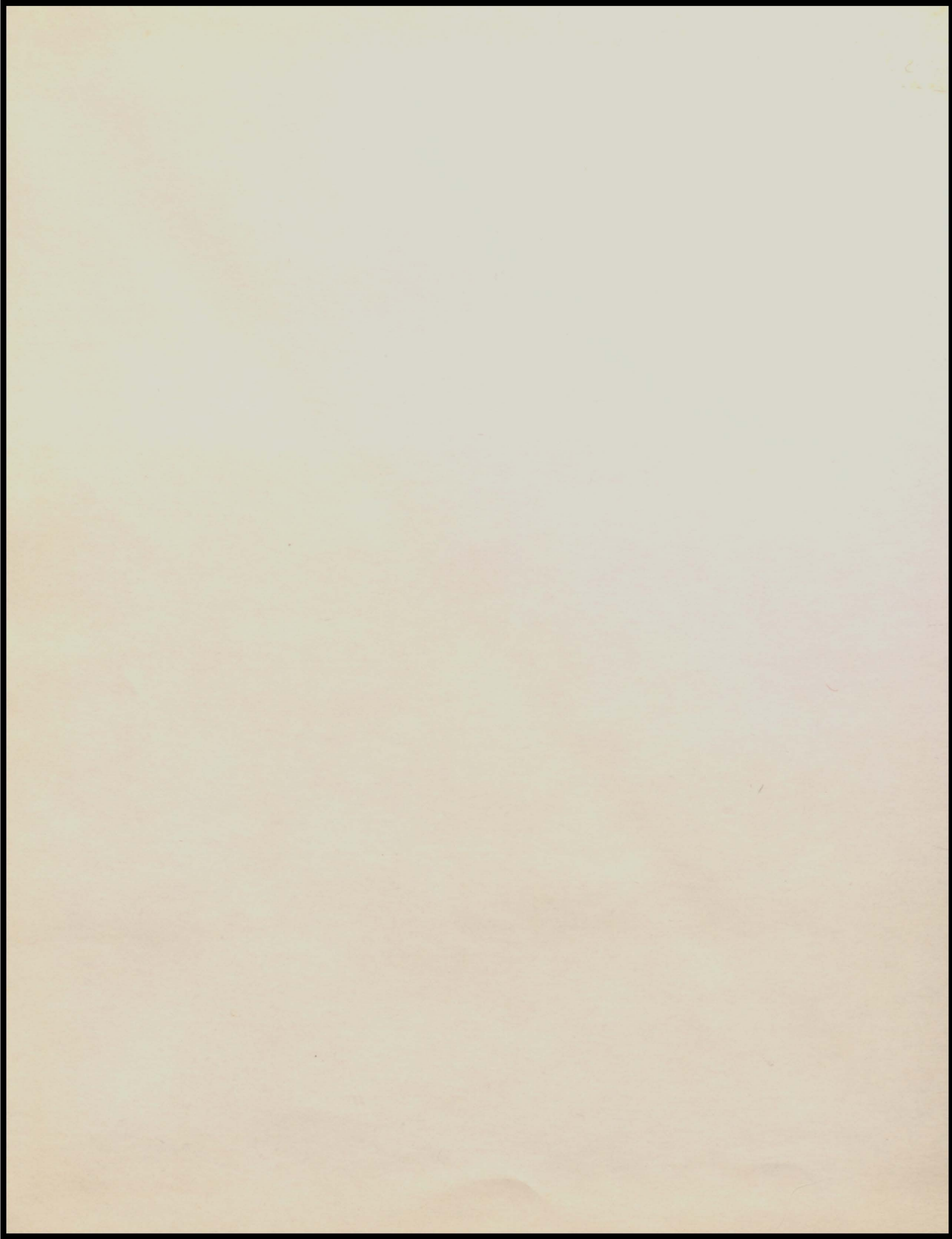

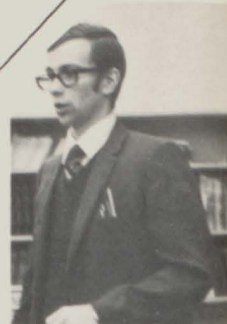

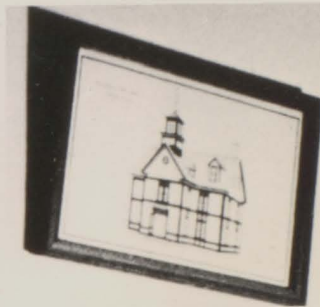
GENERAL INFORMATION.

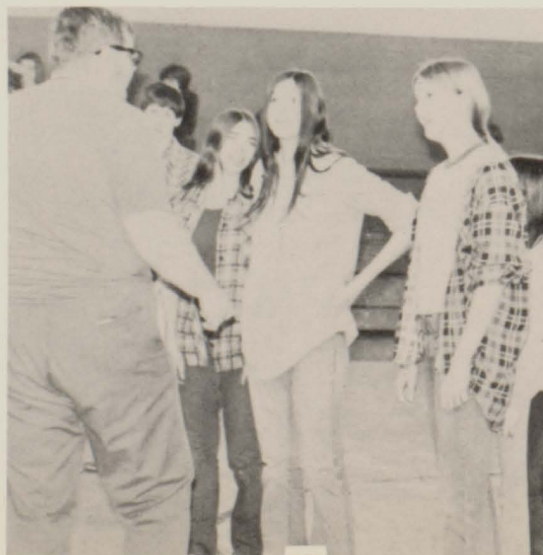




WINTER PHYS ED
