Not only has she given to the past and present generations, but she has also contributed to the future, through her unselfish gifts to the new high school building.

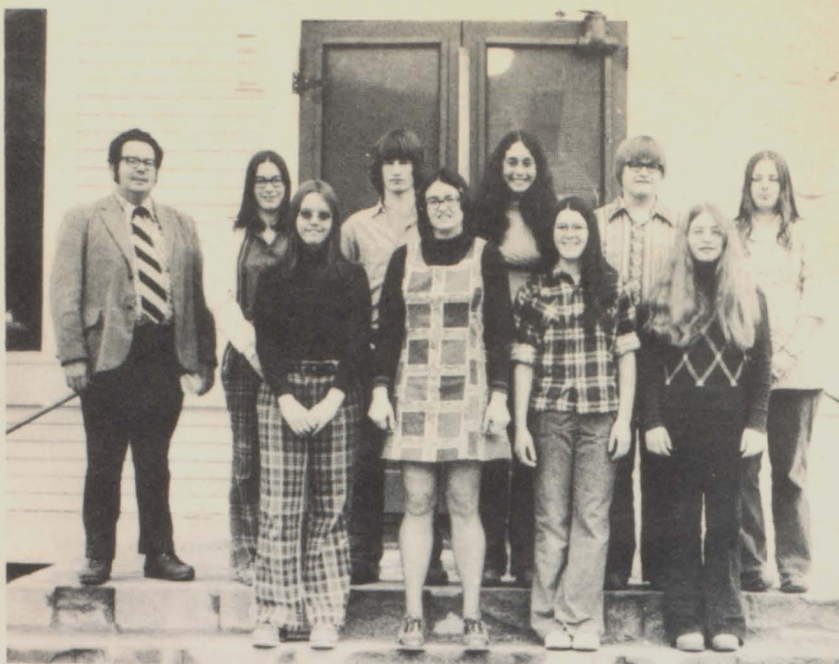

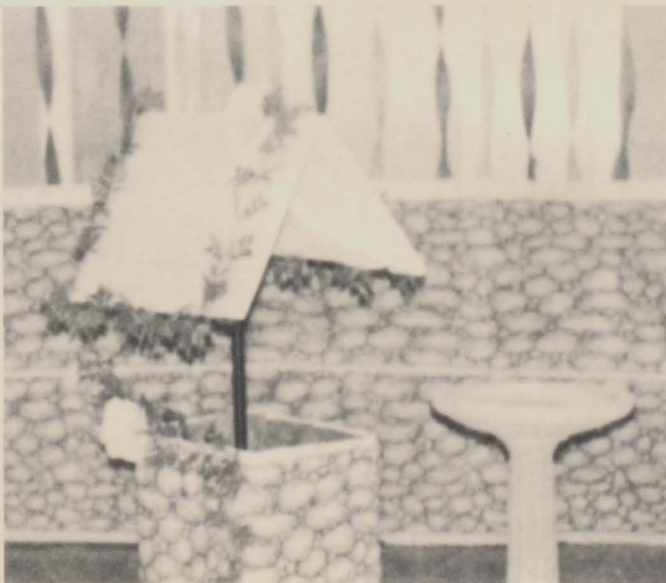
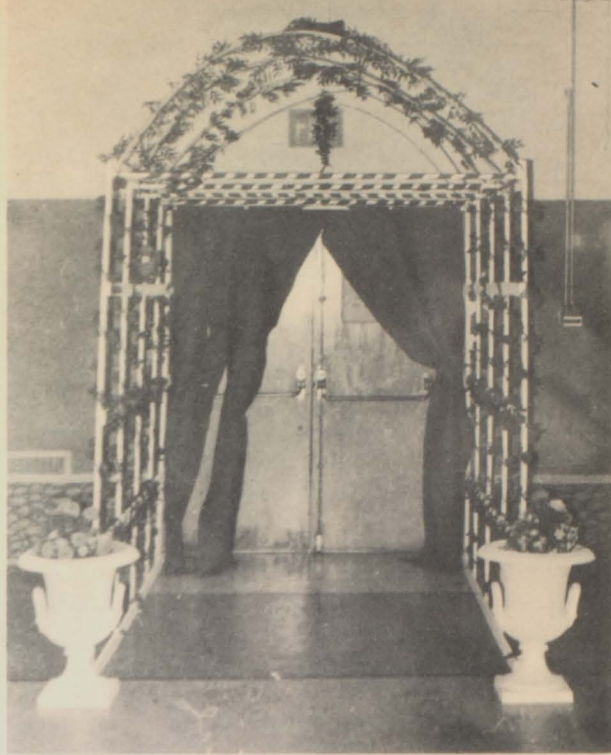




GARDEN OF EDEN

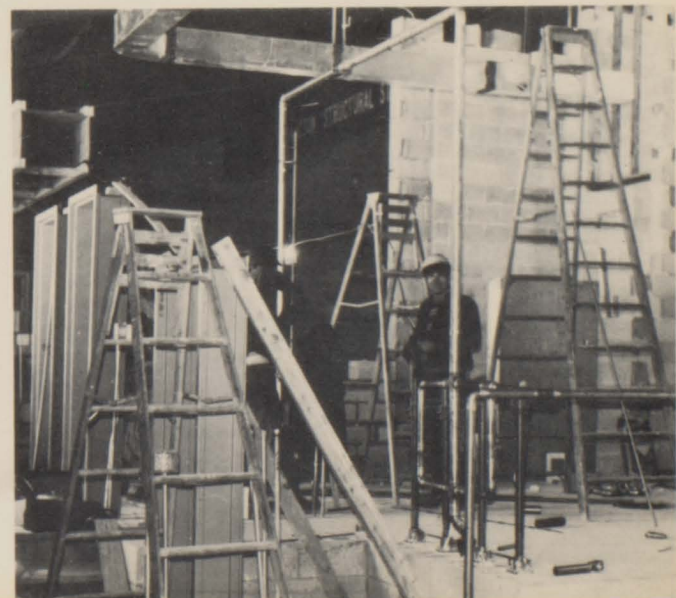
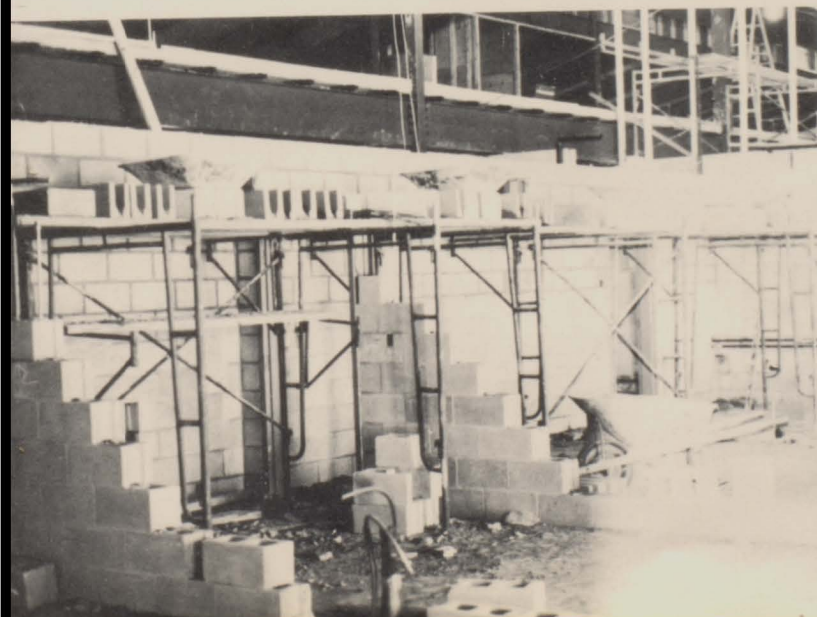
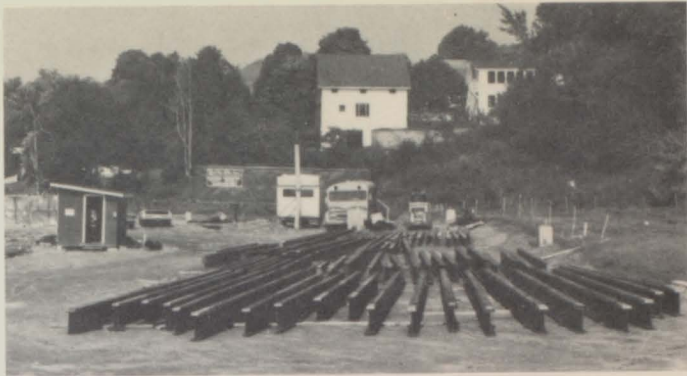
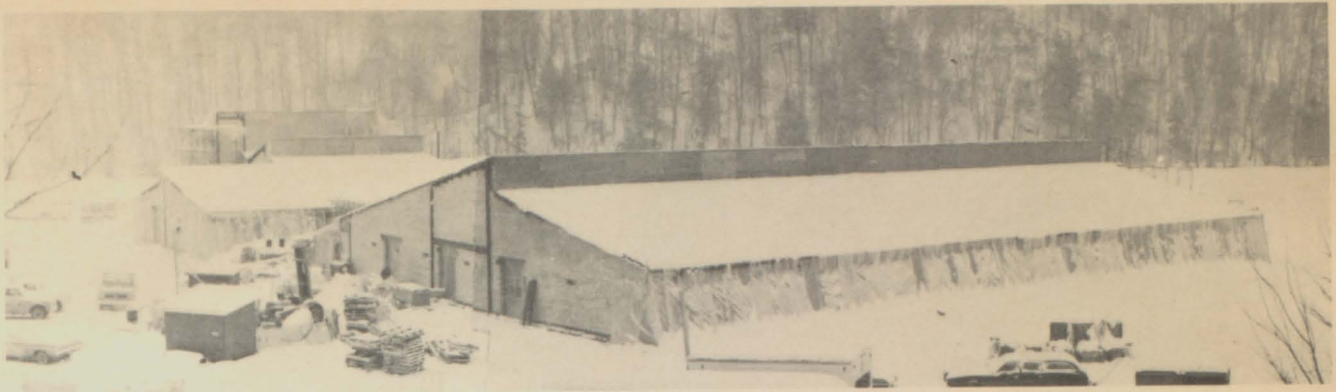


Construction Site

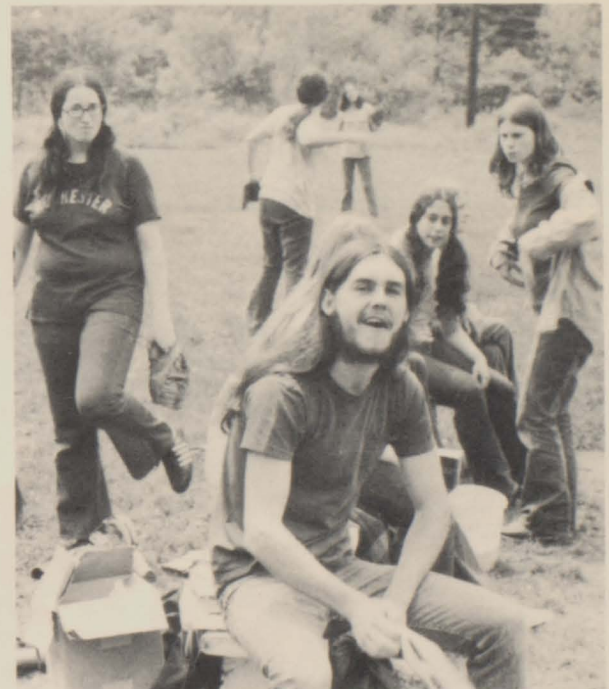

There was a playoff game with a very tough Sacred Heart team which defeated Rochester by a score of 64-49.



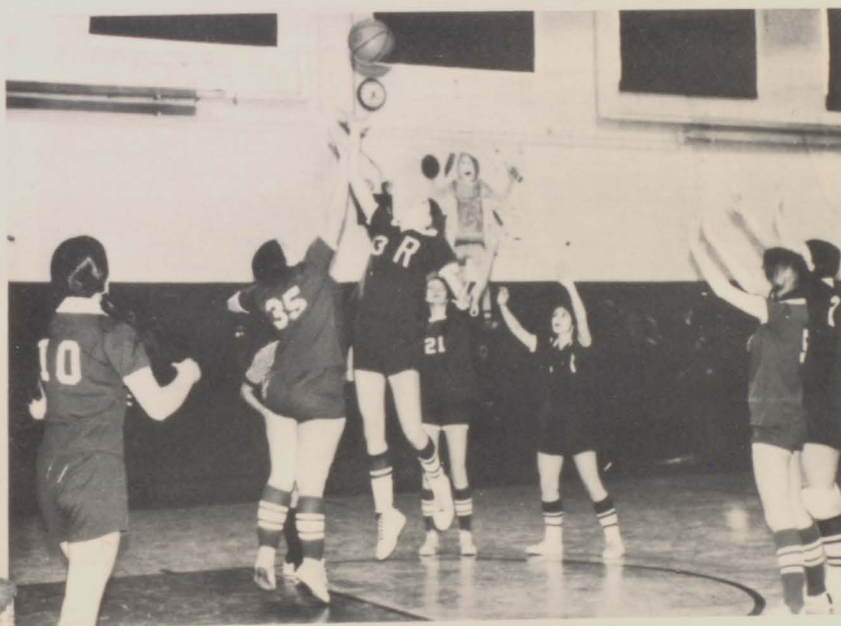
