The team has 5 departing seniors; Peter Parrish, Tim Billings, Tim Davis, Kyle Lizotte, and Greg Bean.

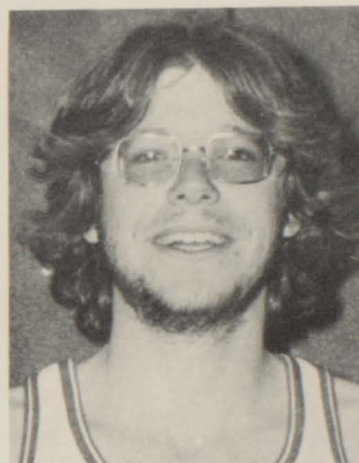
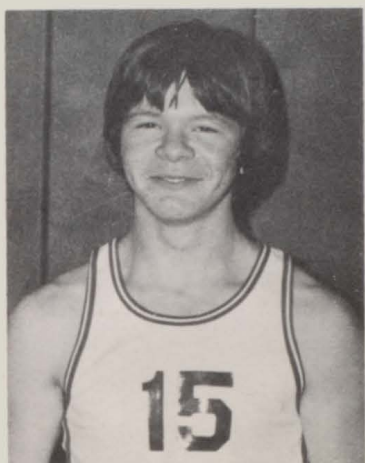
