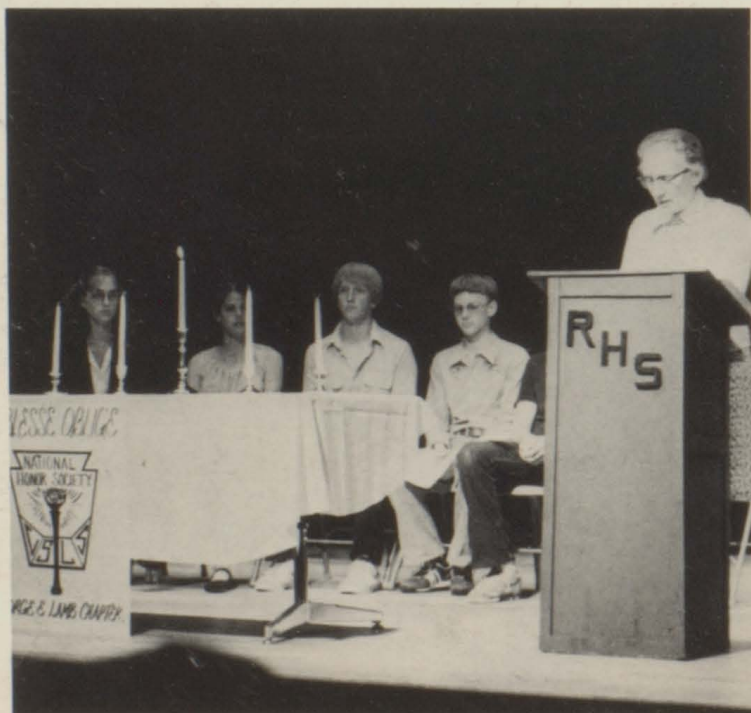
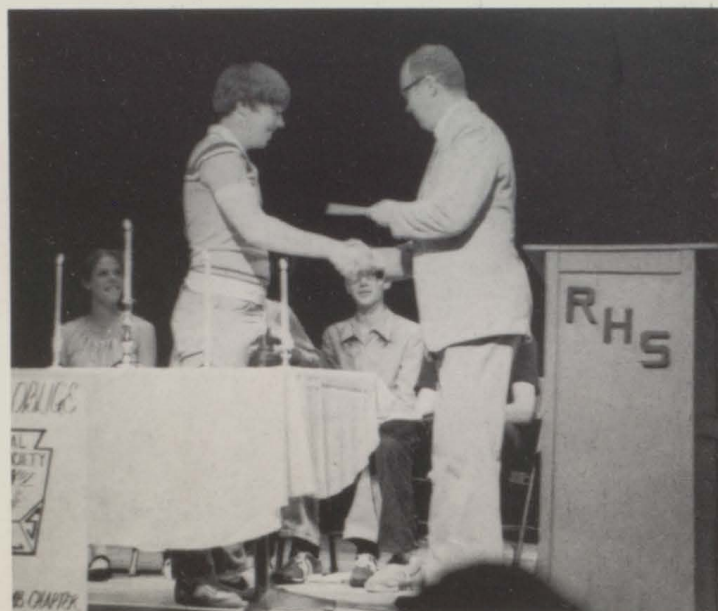


Honor Society

The Baccalaureate ceremony was held at the Rochester Federated Church on Thursday, June 17, which began commencement exercises for the class of 1982.

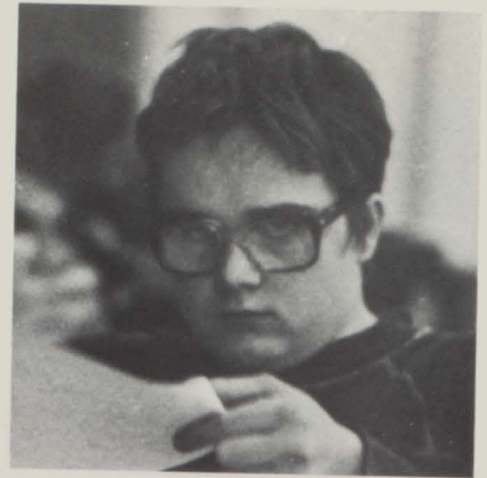
