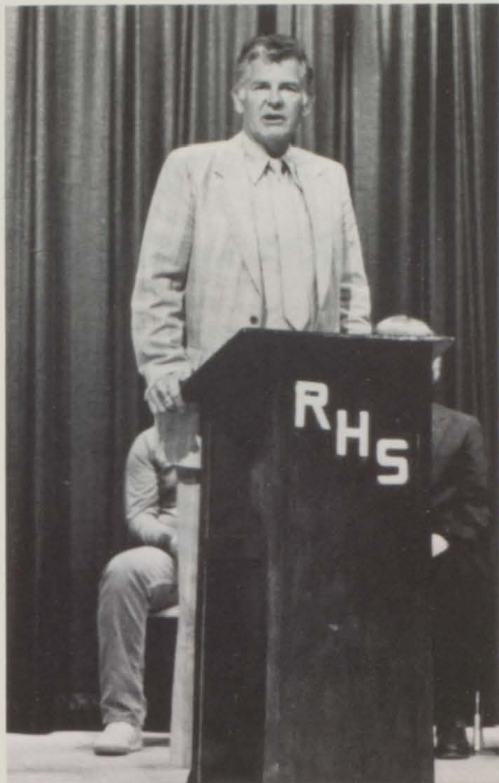


HONOR SOCIETY

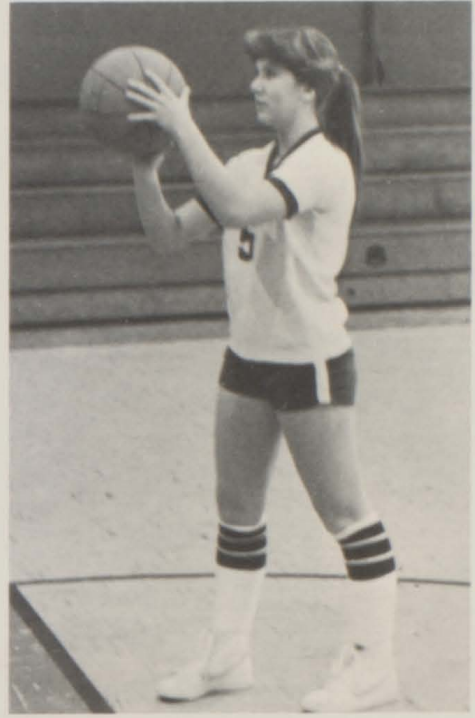
84-85 Girls Basketball
