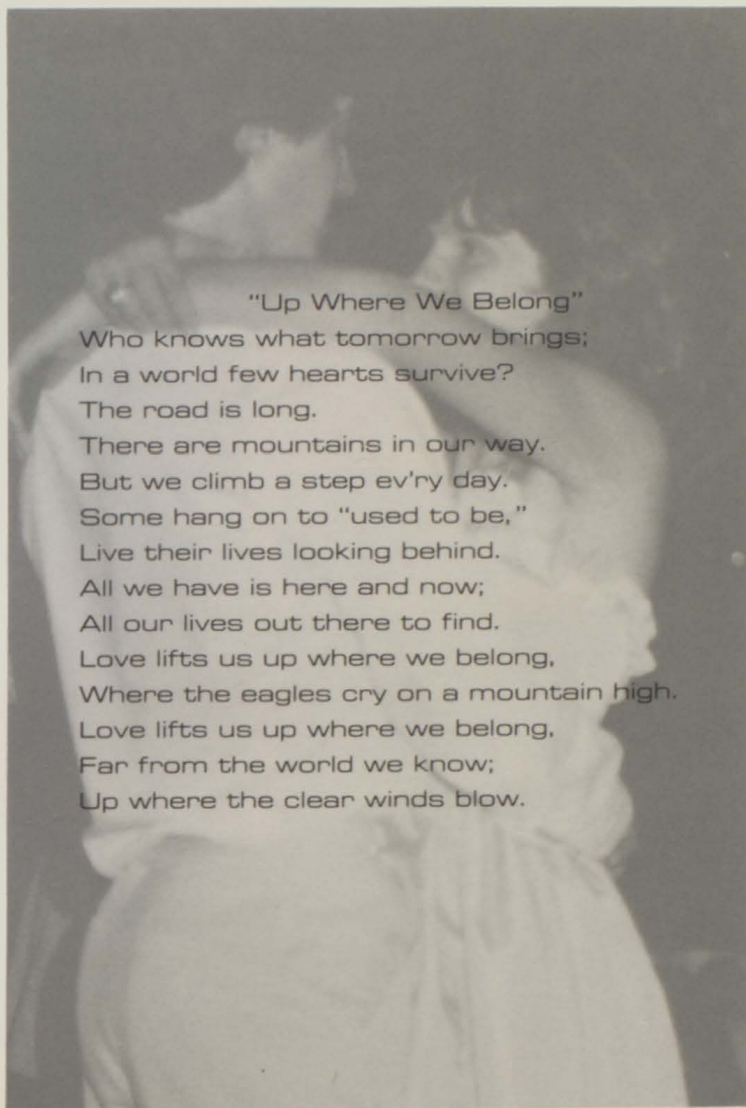
PROM

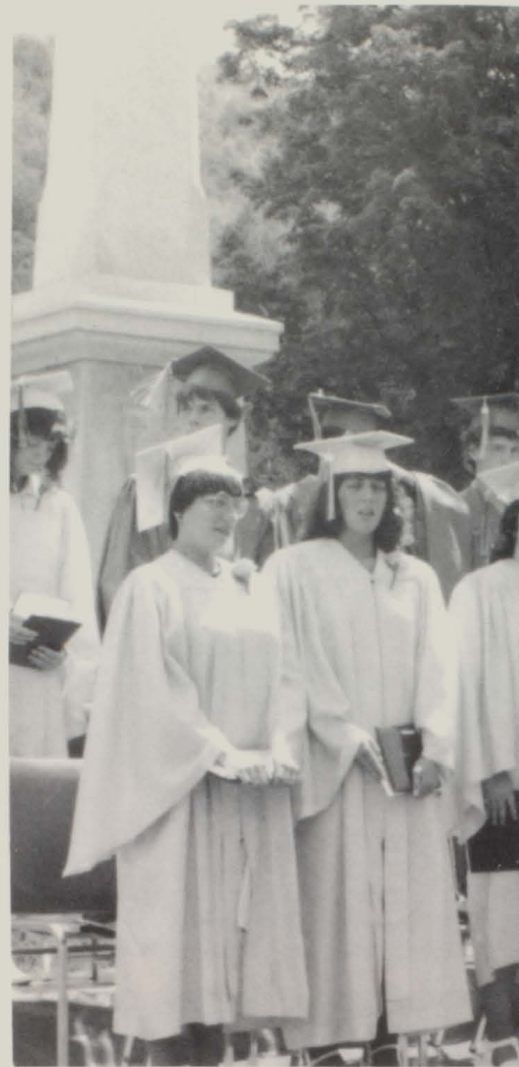

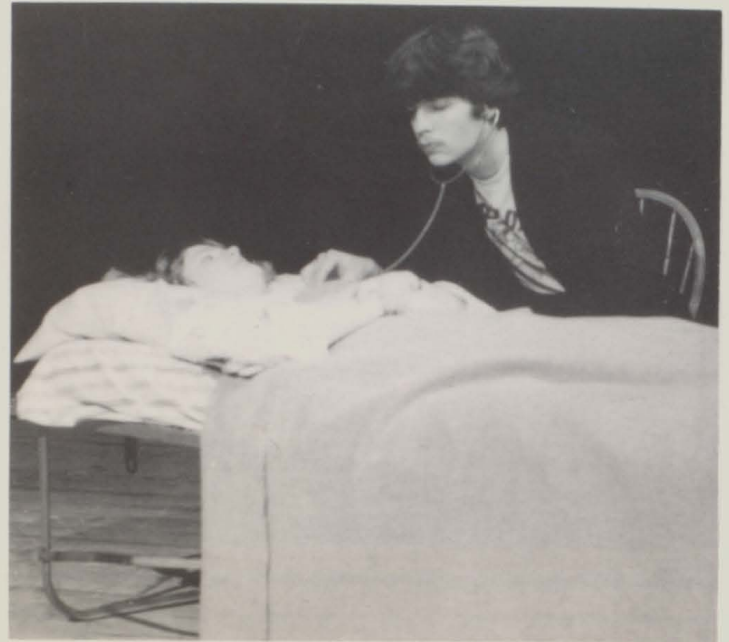
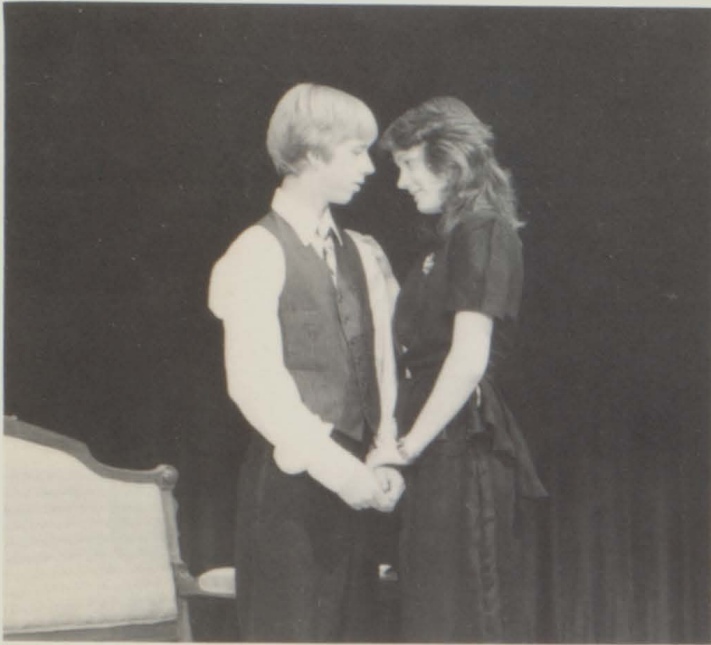
THE GRADUATES

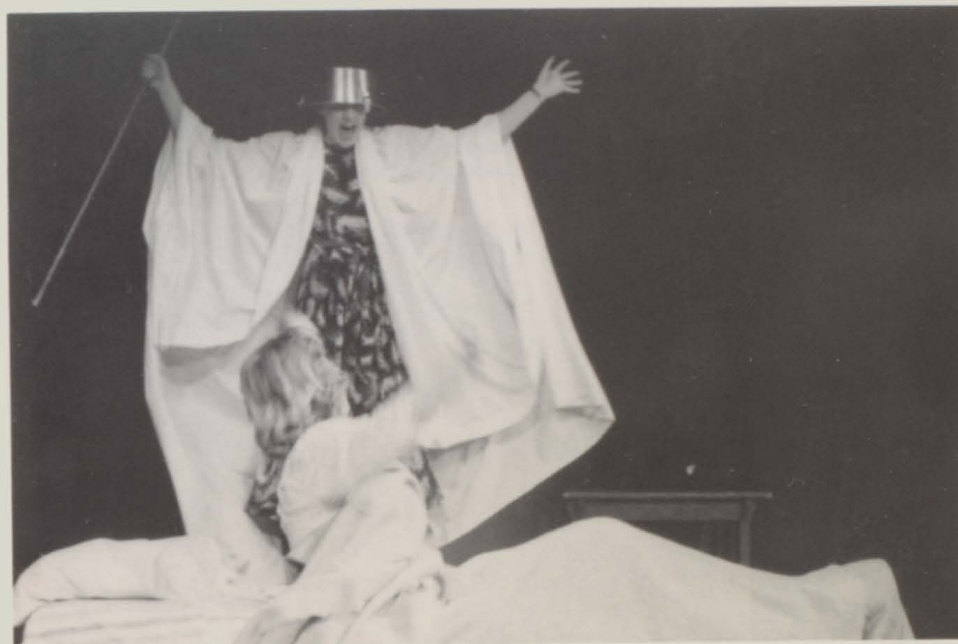


Curse You, Jack Dalton

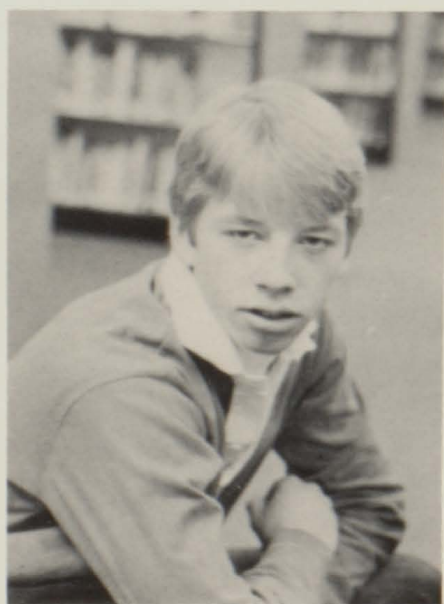

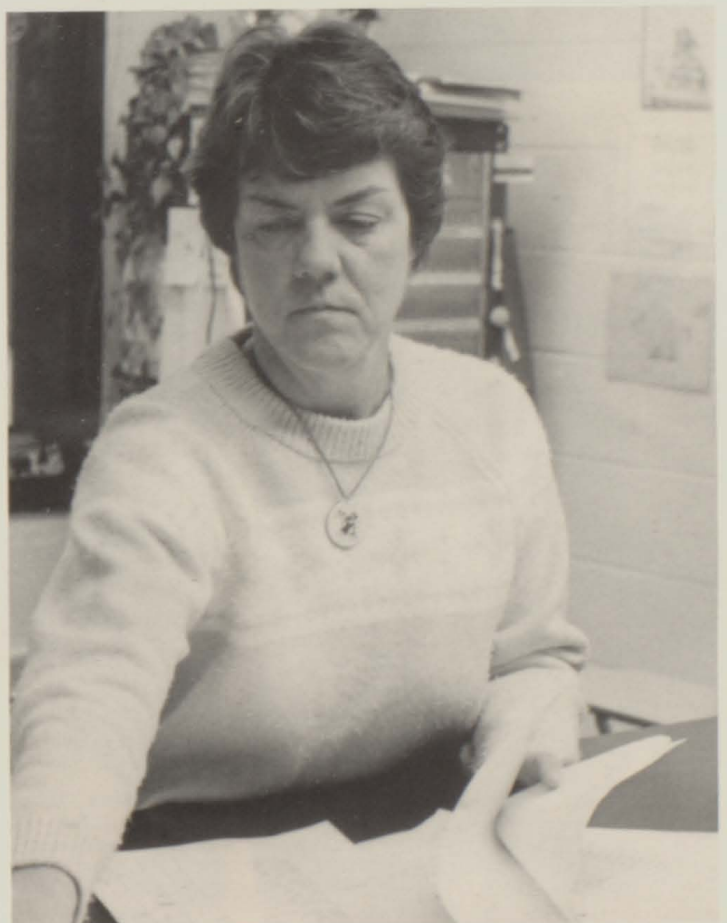

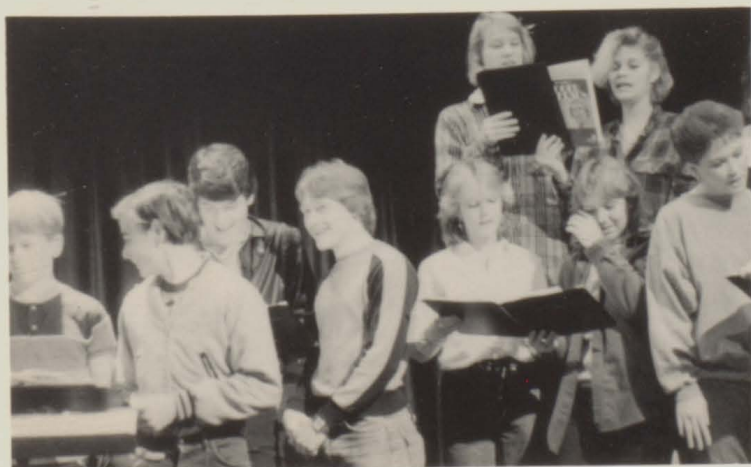

In the post season, the Rockets were seeded third in Division IV, defeating Chelsea in the quarter-finals 3-0. Next the Rockets met second seeded Oxbow in the semi-finals where they were defeated 1-0. Capturing the CVL Championship was the high point of the year for the Rockets, losing one league game to Thetford.

The team was led by nine starting seniors and co-captains Wendy Hartshorn and Beth Osborn. Returning next year will be two juniors, one sophomore, three freshmen, and two eighth graders.
