




#### NOW AND FOREVER 1987














#### VARSITY HOOP










Rochester finished the '87-'88 season with a 4-15 record. This record, however, is not accurate in illustrating the ability of the team. In many games Rochester led at half-time, and the Rockets lost seven games by an average of only five points.

The team went through most of the season relying heavily on the starters, who accounted for 86% of the team's total offense. The starting five combined for a season total of 871 points, and a per game average of 47.5 points. The starters were led by a trio of seniors — forwards Matt Meagher (5.3 ppg) and David Sird (12.9 ppg), and guard Jason Schroer (12.6 ppg). The seniors provided tremendous amounts of leadership which carried the Rockets. Their contribution will be missed.

The loss of the three seniors leaves many gaps to be filled, but the future looks very promising for the young Rochester team. With many young, talented players moving up to the varsity team, and with two junior starters returning (Pat Gentron — 6.2 ppg and Chellis Lanpher — 10.5 ppg), Coach Blair expects the team to remain a growing force in the league.




All players gained valuable game experience, especially Chet Baxter, Marc Spring, and Chellis Lanpher in pitching, and David Sird in catching.

Only three players left the team: Ray Shepard, Leroy Greene, and Russell Goodwin. The rest should come back with a strong attitude and a winning team.








