Becca Carleton — Buys Big Valley Farm and turns it into a successful horse ranch.

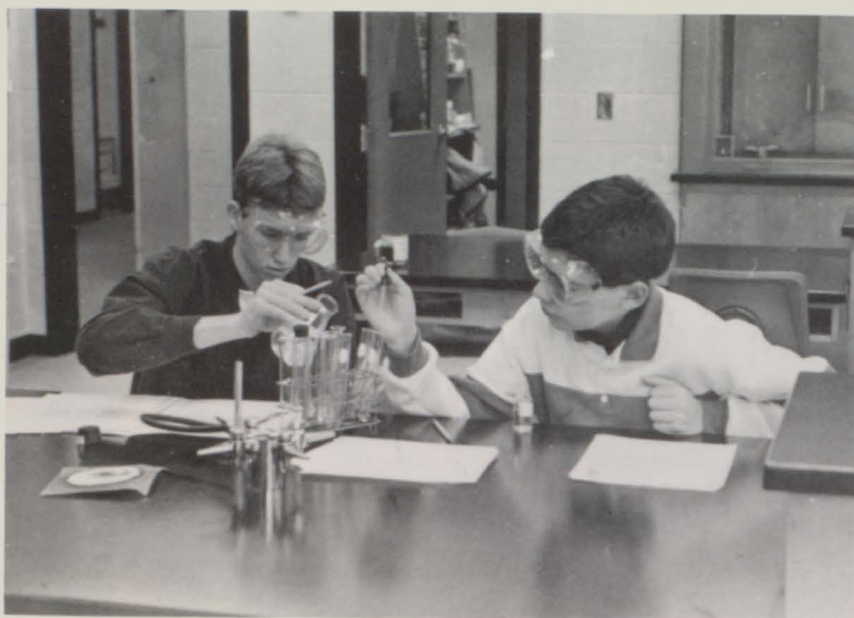

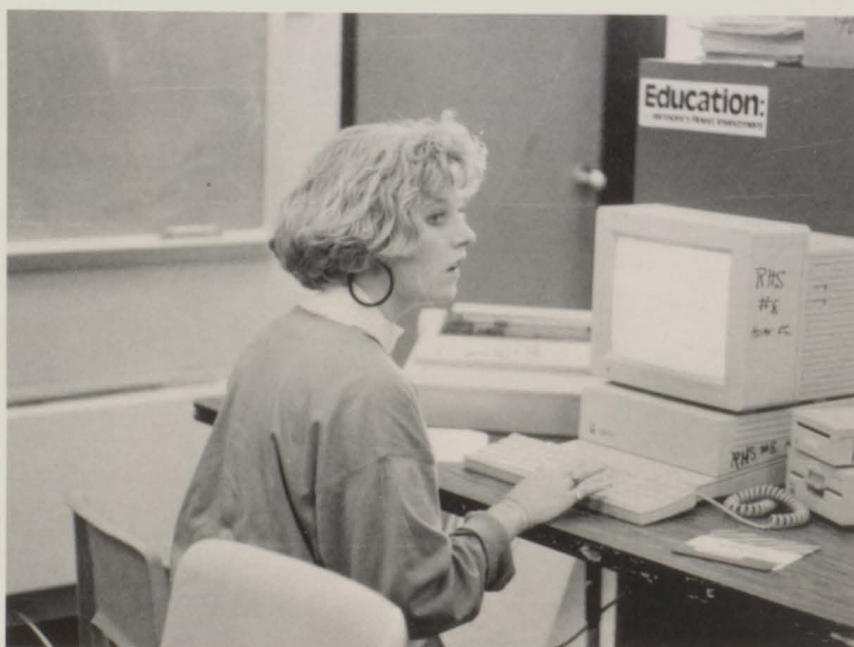
COMING TO AMERICA: A GERMAN LOOKS AT US

Carla Fothergill: A teacher who tries to keep learning as fun and interesting as possible.

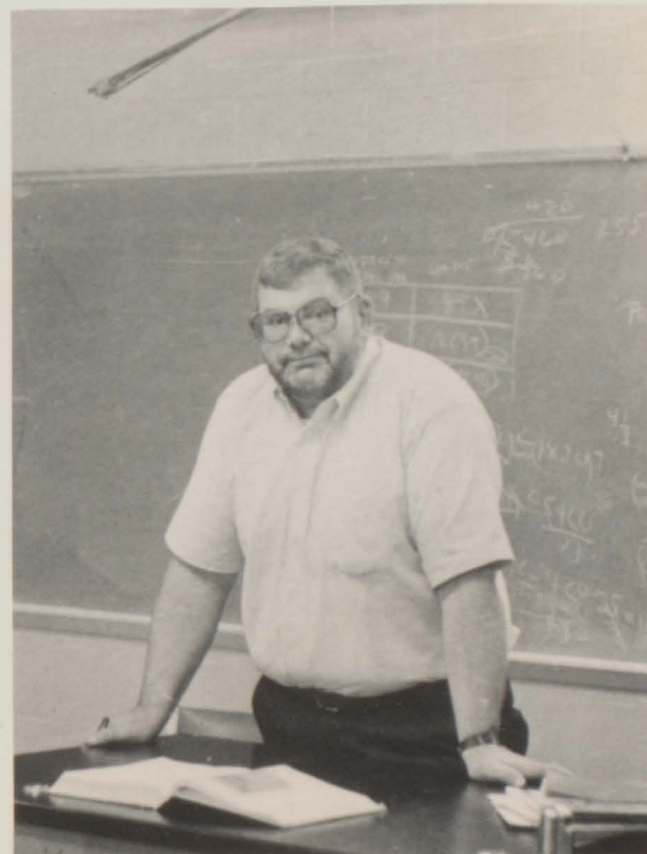

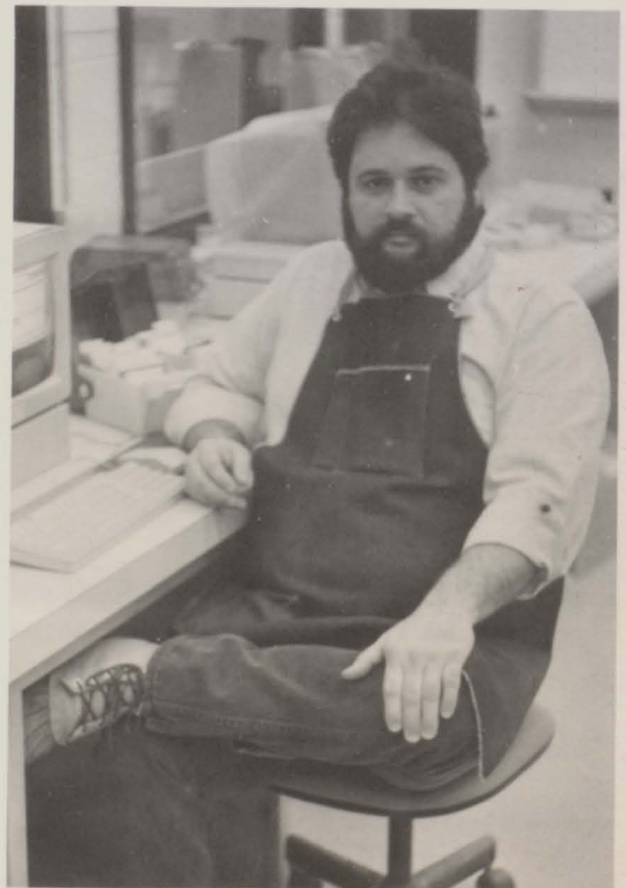
Mrs. Collins is interested in old-time movies and music, especially 1940's and classical. She loves to read and is an active member of the World Organization of China Painting.

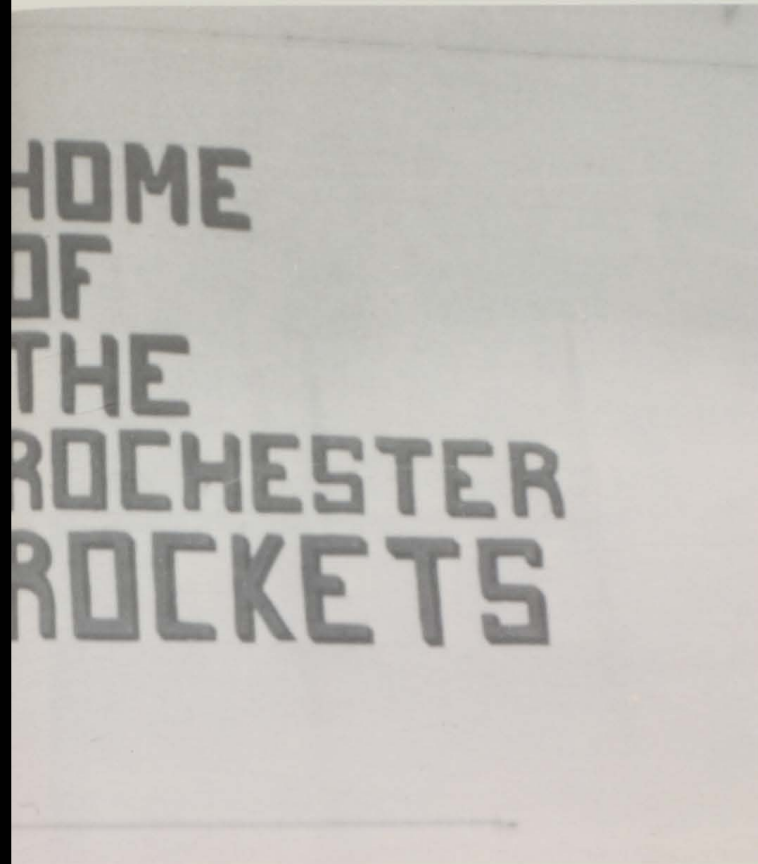

The Rochesterian began publication in November, 1989 as a cooperative effort among language and technology departments to produce a quarterly school newspaper using modern computer technology.

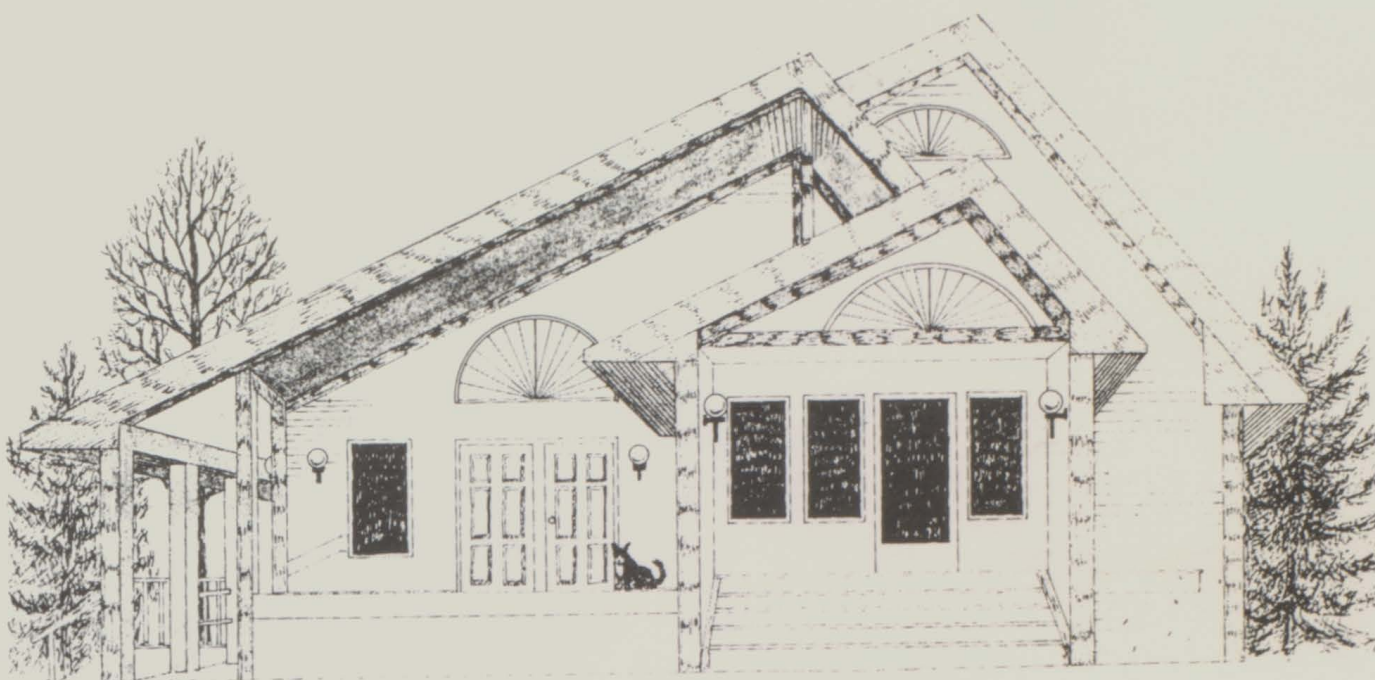

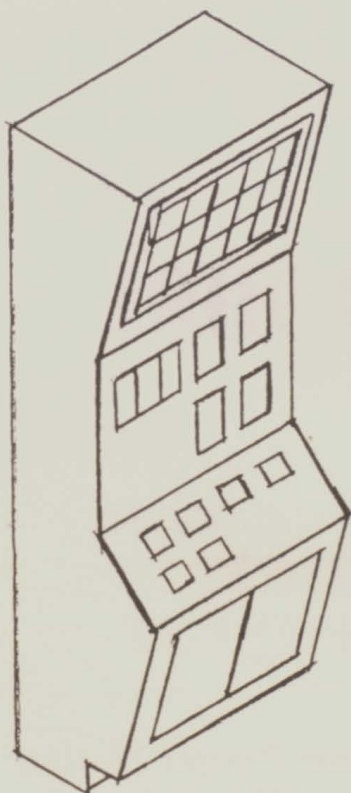
