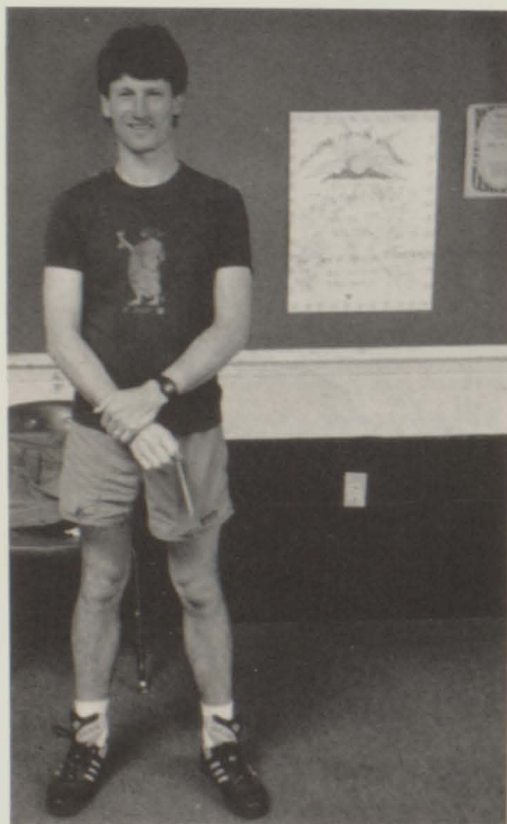
ENGLISH AND SOCIAL STUDIES

MIDDLE SCHOOL

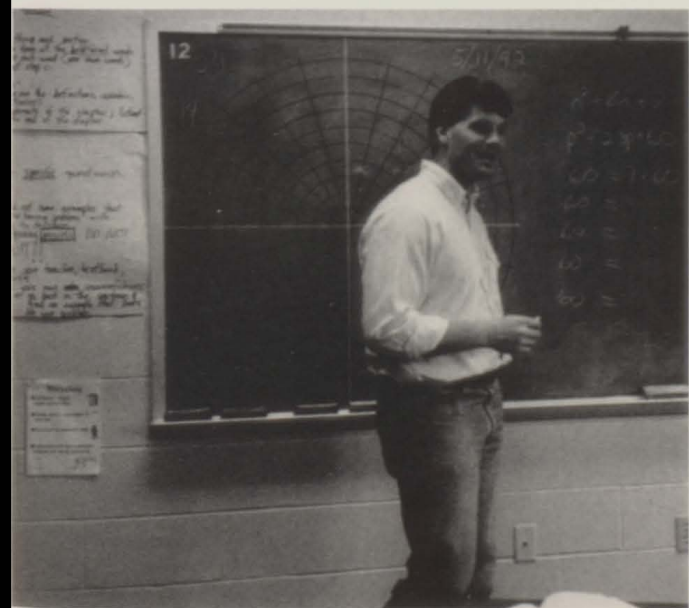

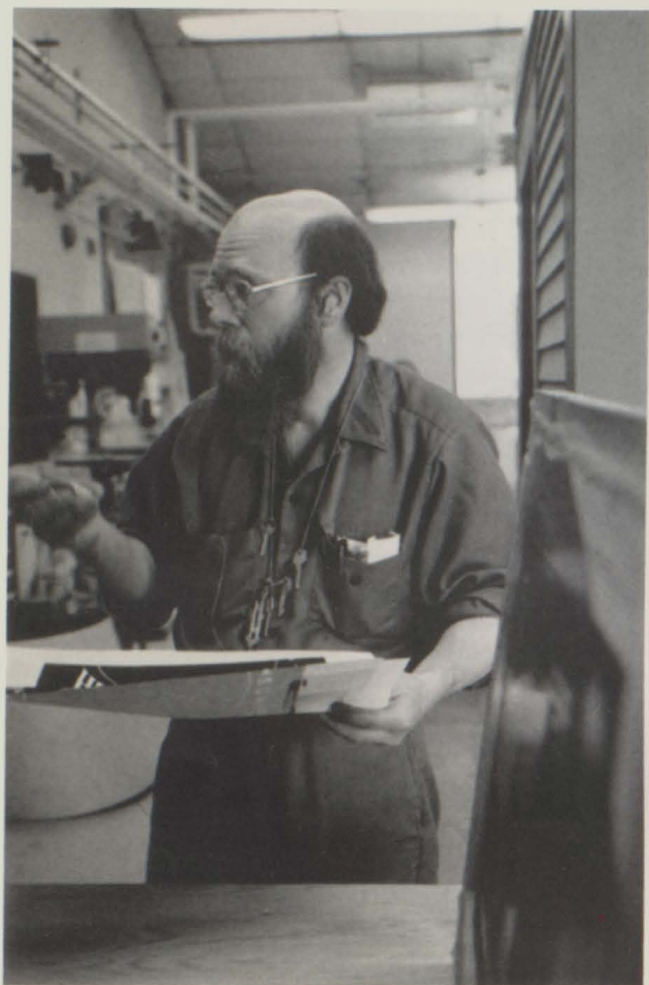


PAUL MORRISON

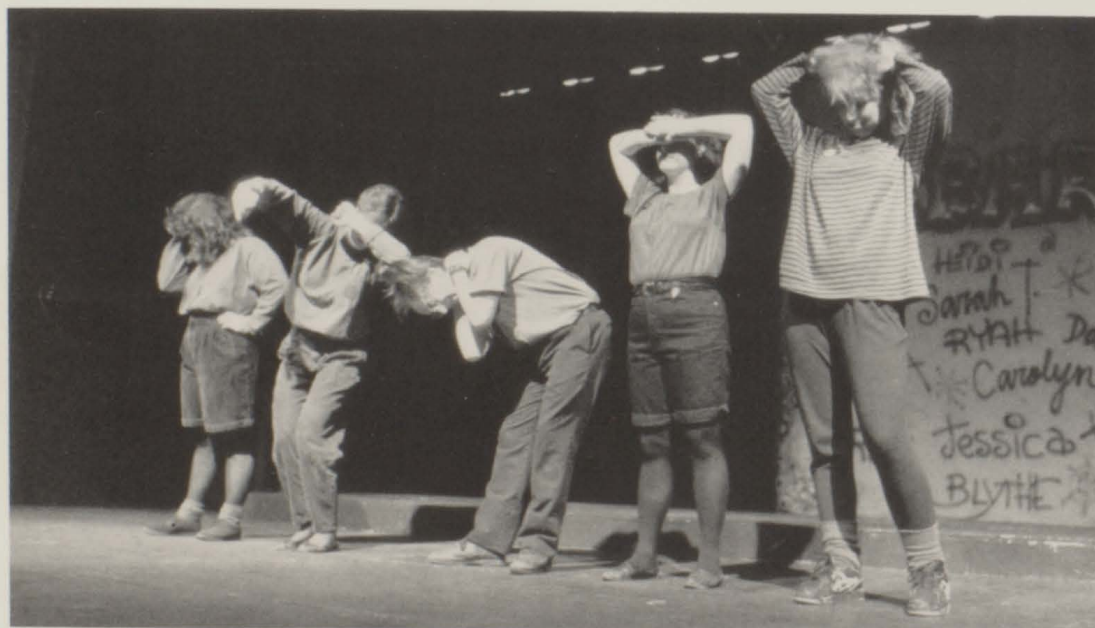


THE TAMING OF THE SHREW

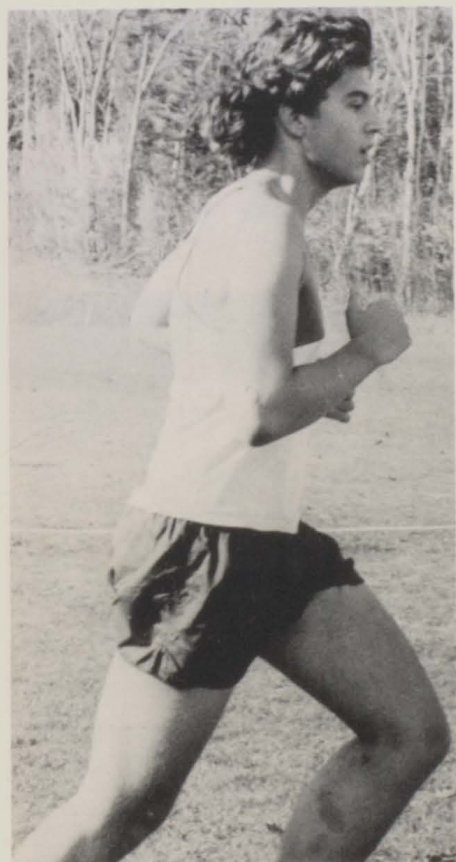
