Commencement

(As Reported by Martha Slater in the June 23rd White River Herald)

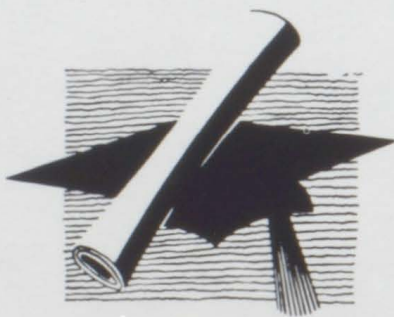
The 100th class to graduate from Rochester High School had a "hot time" on the Rochester Park on Saturday, June 18, as the centennial commencement ceremony took place under a scorchingly sunny sky that made many onlookers retreat to the relatively minor relief of the patches of shade supplied by the tall trees ringing the graduation site. However, the 97-degree heat couldn't wilt the excitement of the 25 new graduates ready to head out into the world beyond Rochester. The seniors were led to the dais on the Park by class marshals Alyssa Wells and Josh Prelas to the familiar *Pomp and Circumstance* played by Carol Chase.

The salutatory address was given by Johanna Shaw who stated her belief that "challenges are a call to a personal contest. They strengthen you mentally and physically... Challenges are not something to fight against, but something to take on." Valedictorian Jennifer Arsenault shared several poems and said "If you don't know where you want to go in life, the path you take doesn't matter. Only you can decide which way to go."

Vermont film director Jay Craven (*Where the River Flows North*) delivered the Charge to the Class to "trust in your own abilities to accomplish." Mr. Craven continued "... I have come through a process in my 20 years in Vermont because it was a place that allowed me that freedom. We live in a part of the world that is specific and special, in a world that I feel is becoming increasingly generic ... When I made 'Where the River Flows North,' I made a film about what I knew. I learned many lessons on making it:

- 1) nothing worth having comes easily;
- 2) be willing to take risks,
- 3) become involved in a process of discovery, and
- 4) have the intangible element of faith ... believe in yourself."

Mr. Craven concluded by advising the class of 1994 to "become actors rather than spectators in your own history," and wishing them "good sailing."

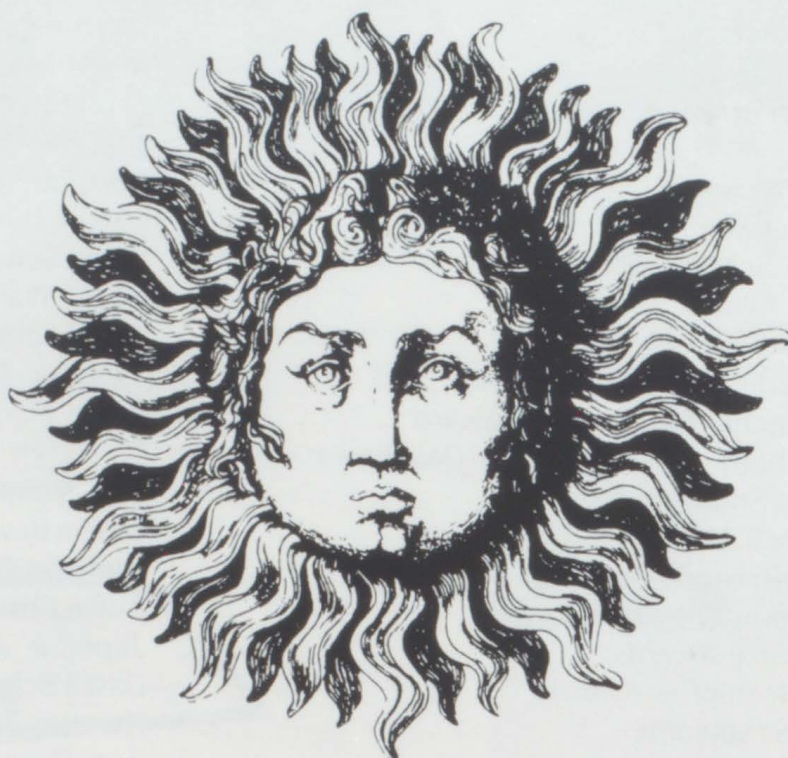

Rochester High School 1894-1994

The 1993-1994 Senior class of Rochester High School represents the 100th graduating class. It is only fitting that such a landmark be recorded for posterity. In that spirit, the next few pages will take note of the people, places and things that have shaped the first 100 years of Rochester High School history. Special thanks to Ro Hubbard, Lillian Marsh and the others that helped with their remembrances and historical information.



First Graduates:

The first class to graduate from the Old High School did so in 1894. The class included George E. Lamb, Ella E. Swinyer, Alice Whitlock (Gypson), Lilla A. Hubbard (Abbott), Alice Newton (Brooks), Lucia E. Van Dyke (Nickerson), Bertha A. Ball (Henry), and Carrie C. Jones (Bush).

In the 100 year history of Rochester High School there have been 1312 graduates.

Buildings:

The **Old Brick School** was located on Bethel Mountain road, the third house on the left. It was built in 1828 and was a private High School from 1855-84. Drafting classes were held there briefly in the 1970's. The bell from the from the **Old Brick School** went to the **Old High School** and to the present school.

The **Old High School** was built in 1884 and was located on the east side of the Town Offices parking lot. The bulding and the rooms were remodeled many times. The weathervane from the building is now in the Historical Society.

The **Little Building** was built in 1916 and now serves as the Town Offices.

The **G.A.R. Hall** was built in 1889 and was located between the hardware store and Earl & Mary Davis' house. It was originally built for Civil War Veterans and housed a jail in the basement. This building was used for meetings, graduation, basketball, dances, Hot Lunch, study hall and as a library.

Pierce Hall was used for dances, plays, graduation, roller skating and shop.

The **Dandelion Day Care** building once served as the principal's home.

At one point in time, it served as classroom space for Home Economics and Art.

The **New High School** opened in 1974 beside the gymnasium and elementary school.



Some of the more notable activities and events

School Forest, which was acquired in the late 1940's. In 1948 classes were planting trees and a Forestry Club was established in 1955.

Alumni Association, which was started in 1904. Their scholarship fund was established in 1955.

Special Week, a week traditionally the week of Memorial Day where students travel "somewhere" in order to broaden their horizons. Some examples might be Vermont, cities such as this year's trips to New York, Philadelphia, Mystic, places like Ottawa and Quebec, Cape Cod. Activities are as varied as the imagination and RHS students have enjoyed diverse experiences ranging from museums, oceans, flying and cooking to visiting business and industry and attending a Major League Baseball game! Students are intricately involved with the planning and fund raising for **Special Week**.

Community Affairs, ranging from Green Up Days to Intergenerational programs, including the White River Player performances.

National Honor Society, Chartered January 12, 1961 and named for George E. Lamb, member of the first graduating class of 1894.

Exodus 1977, a trek across the USA and back.

Mrs. Katharine Pardee Kirkpatrick, a generous benefactor to the town and school. When she celebrated her 100th birthday, the entire school went to her home and sang *Happy Birthday*.

Curriculum Development

Rochester High School evolved over the years from having one principal and one aide and emphasizing college preparatory courses, to its present staff and curriculum offerings. Changes remembered by Ro Hubbard include: Driver's Education, Family and Consumer Science, Technology, Chorus, Band, Art, Business, Physical Education, Vocational School, Junior High, Middle School and Computerization.

Physical Education came to be offered with the mission of helping young people develop life-long healthful interests. Originally, Phys. Ed. was taught on Wednesday afternoons with each faculty member leading a program. Later, under the direction of the physical education director, many activities were offered including hiking, biking, golf, tennis, archery, orienteering, skiing, folk dancing, roller skating, ice skating, swimming, canoeing, sailing. Mrs. Kirkpatrick made many contributions for equipment, including the sailboat. Gymnasium use went from the GAR Hall to the present youth hostel (in 1939) and then to the new school in 1956.

Sports have always played an important role in RHS history. Early, basketball and baseball, hockey and football (in 1909 at least), tennis, field hockey, cross country, softball and skiing (from the early 1960's). A few of the names important to these years included Cleo Johnson, who drove a bus to away games from 1933 to 1964. Also, Mickey Lary, who was involved with sports, physical education and innovative science programs for many years. Last, but by no means least, is Lillian Marsh. Lillian graduated in the school's 30th year, 1924. Lillian taught at RHS, started the National Honor Society and her voice has been heard rooting enthusiastically at both home and away games.

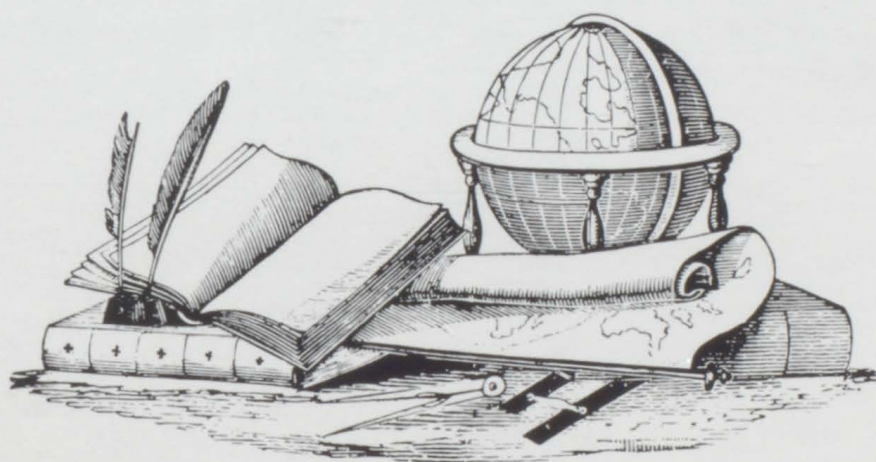
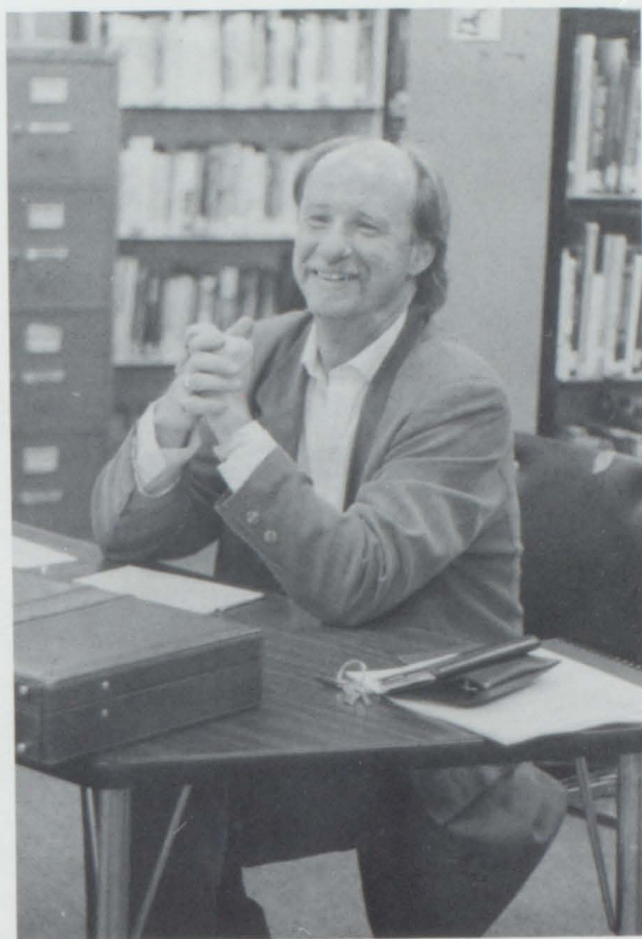
Ms. Bonney is a native of Montreal and has taught in Florida and South Carolina. This is her third year as Principal of Rochester Schools.

Rochester Girls Prove Power

Sometimes, even after a sports season is over and the champion has been crowned, there is still some debate among fans as to what team was really the best.

No one can make such a case this year when the subject is Vermont Division IV girls softball. The Rochester Rockettes humbled the defending state champion Canaan Eagles with a convincing 21-1 rout in Randolph on Friday to claim the school's first female title in over a decade.

The Rockettes clearly dominated the opposition this spring, not losing a game in their division all season, and sweeping three games against their most challenging foe, Whitcomb of Bethel.

Friday's championship game looked to be a real test for Rochester. Rochester played generally steady, confident defense in support of winning pitcher Erin Parrish, and fully capitalized upon every available opportunity on offense. Taking advantage of numerous walks and Canaan errors, the Rockettes ran the bases especially well, to pile up the unearned runs, and came through with several clutch singles to build up a stunning 18-0 lead after only four innings of play.

ALL of the Rochester starters (Becky Kennedy, Jess Dudley, Erin Parrish, Amy Papa, Jen Arsenault, Ricci Rushton, Corina Gendron, Debbie Glogover and Michelle Gay) scored at least once before Canaan had recorded 12 outs. It was a total team effort with no one shining star, and no weak link.

Schulze had the luxury of emptying the bench with two innings left to play, giving all of his players the chance to share in earning the championship. Canaan was left to throwing knuckleballs to the Rockette hitters late in the game in an effort to salvage something for the afternoon. The visitors did manage to cross the plate once in their final at-bat, but it hardly mattered at that point.

The exhausted Rochester players enjoyed their celebration and their bus ride home, announcing their successful mission by screaming out the bus windows in jubilation as they circled the Park. It marked the beginning of a truly memorable 24 hours for the seniors, who graduated the next morning.
